The Fishes

William Fish, and his wife, Sallie Woolbert Fish were living in Stroudsburg, Pennsylvania in the year 1850. The Fish ancestry was generally English, but the woolbert side was Pennsylvania Dutch. There is not much known of earlier ancestors on the Fish side, and nothing of the ancestry on the Woolbert side. William Fish's father, Abner, was a canal boat man on the "Delaware-Lackawaxon Canal". He lived to be 97, and my father remembered him very well. He loved to tell of his canal boat days and told tall tales of his fights with "The bloody, redmouthed Irishmen" with whom he came in contact.

William Fish, Abner's oldest son, was a stone mason, and in 1850 his second son, James Stalbert was born. The Fish men of this generation were big men, around six feet in

height, and of some of them it was said that they didn't know their own strength. James Stalbert was called Stalbert by his father and mother, but he soon acquired the name,

"Stub", which stuck with him all of his life. There was a good reason--Stub was a runt. His mature

height was five feet and four inches, but he was no weakling and grew up to be a powerful "little man." The Fishes seemed to have lived in the Stroudsburg vicinity from at least Revolutionary War days, but in 1856 William Fish moved his family to Iowa. William's brother, Pete, had moved to Iowa the year previously, and half of a double log cabin was waiting for them. The family took the train from Pennsylvania to Rock Island, Illinois, ferried the river to Davenport, bought a team, a couple of cows and a crate of chickens and drove by team and wagon across Eastern Iowa through Des Moines and on twenty miles to the little town of DeSoto in souther Iowa. James, or Stub, had gone to school for one winter in Pennsylvania, but the move to Iowa ended his schooling for Iowa was almost raw prairie, and civilization had touched it very lightly at that time. William worked as a stone mason for several years, and there are still in the 1970's a few buildings in he DeSoto area with limestone foundations which he "laid up". William also farmed many years in the Adel and Waukee areas. He lived to be 88 years old, and he and his wife, who had died much earlier, are buried in a cemetary [sic] south of Wuakee. I can barely remember him, but he always seemed grumpy to me. Someone once told me that he like [sic] little girls better than little boys, and I remember that he liked to hold my sister, Doris, on his lap, but that he didn;t want anything to do with me. I can remember the day of his funeral. It was a bitter cold day, and the funeral party went in bobsleds the ten miles from my grandparents' farm to the Waukee cemetary [sic] and return. The

funeral was an all day affair with only brief services at home and at the cemetary, with most of the time being spent on the road.

I spent many summers on my grandfather's farm, and as he sat on the front porch during the long {the text ended here]

I have a biographical excerpt from the Adel, Dallas County, Iowa Quasquicentennial book (period covered 1847-1972) regarding the John Longmire family: One of the earliest pioneer families of the Adel area was John Longmire who came by covered wagon and four ox team, from near Wheeling, Penn., with his wife Melinda, to whom he had married on 1 Jan 1828. In Feb. 1846 John Longmire and Tristram

Davis came and made claims of land on So. Raccoon River bottoms in Adams township. The following May they moved their families here. Fourteen children were born to John and Melinda Longmire. The original homestead was occupied by their descendants for over a hundred years. Their ninth child, Leroy Longmire, owned and operated the farm with his two sons, Clarence and Eldon, until his death in 1948. The house, one of the show places of the community was completed of walnut cut from the farm, taken to a mill in Des Moines to be sawed into lumber. LeRoy Longmire was born in a log cabin 15 Feb 1851. He married Miss Emmerette Winans 5 Jan 1873. To this union were born, Don, who died at an early age, Clarence Charles Eldon, Grace, Dell and Claude. An uncle of Mrs. Longmire, BTU Winans was a pioneer groceryman in Adel. LeRoy was in active management of the land for many years and also managed a produce business in Adel for thirteen years, driving back and forth to work. He purchased land in southern Texas and lived there part of the time while his two sons, Clarence and Eldon operated the home farm. In his later years he spent many winters in California, returning home in the spring. His wife passed away in 1924, and he then made his home with his son Clarence and later with his daughter Grace, in Des Moines. He died at the age of 97 years on 7 Jun 1948. All but two of his children preceded him in death. The only descendants of LeRoy Longmire, still residing in the area (in 1972) is Mrs. Richard Wiles (Wynette) of Adel, and Mrs. Francis (Dorothy) Daugherty of Van Meter, daughters of Eldon Longmire. Several family burials are in the Longmire-Emehiser Cemetery in Dallas County. --Sharon Glenn

From the info below, it could be assumed that when Peter moved to Chicago, he took Abner with him. Sometime after Margaret died (1866) and before 1870, Abner moved in with Peter. We can place Peter and Abner in Iowa in 1880, Peter in Chicago as early as 1884 and Abner's headstone shows he died at the end of 1891. After living with Peter for at least 10 years and maybe as long as 18 years (1866 to 1884), it seems very likely that Abner moved with Peter to Chicago.

Abner's grandson's biography (Adrian L Fish) says says Abner died in Chicago while living with his son Peter. Therefore, it is highly likely that Abner died in Chicago and was brought back to Iowa to be buried in Xenia cemetery.

"My grandfather was George Longmire, born either in TN or VA in1786. I think he married Sarah Haynes in 1806 in Carter Co., Tenn. I know my great uncle Joe was born in Washington Co., TN.George moved to Indiana sometime before 1820, as my grandfather James was born then. He had 12 children. George Longmire later must have moved to Illinois as his will is probated at Joliet, Will County, Illinois. George Longmire served in the war of 1812and was given a grant of land in Illinois Territory. JamesLongmire, my grandfather came to Washington from Indiana in 1853 with his family, the year Washington was created a territory, and made quite a name for himself in the early days. He discovered the mineral springs at the foot of Mt. Ranier thatstill bear his name, and the Post Office, too, in Ranier National Park. He made this discovery in 1883. He cut a roughtrail through the dense wilderness 60 miles from his home of Yenn Pararies to his mineral springs in 1884 and operated ahealth resort until his death in 1897, then my father Elcania Longmire took over the management until his death in 1915. There are no Longmires living there now, for it all belongs to the government. Mother sold her share in 1916,

asking the Ranier National Park to retain the name Longmire. I am a woman of 84 years."

The Westcotts were the most uncompromising of Baptist families. They were exceedingly proud of having, through Stukeley Westcott and his wife, a hand in the historic first Baptist Church in America. The tradition of this has come straight down to the present generation of Rose's descendants, and for the first few generations one of them who dared join some other church was held to have almost put himself outside of the pale of the family. Elizabeth impressed her Baptist principles as strongly on her family, as her mother, Rose, had done on hers. And that is all we really know of those two generations, except the names of their children.

James Greene(4) and Elizabeth had Sarah, born in 1728, Ann, Benjamin, Jeremiah, Dinah, Abel and Deborah.

Benjamin Greene(5), [James(4), John(3), James(2), John(1),] born Aug. 28, 1734, in East Greenwich. Married May 25, 1760, to Comfort Carr, who was also of Lascelle descent. His home was in West Greenwich. Of his children, James, Anstress and Benjamin, there are only birth records.

Caleb Greene(6), 1764 — 1823. Had a son Samuel.

Virtue Greene-Matteson(6), b. May 3, 1767 ; m Edmund Matteson, her distant

cousin. Virtue was a second wife. All of Edmund's children that are known to be

hers, were Virtue, who married her mother's cousin, John Greene. (Abel(5), James(4),

etc.); Lydia, who married Stephen King ; and Stukeley, who had Ira, John and

Stukeley of his own.

Jeremiah Greene (5), b. June 1, 1736 ; ra. Freelove Hopkins, 1760. They had Russell,

Ephraim and Newie had also sons, George, Othniel, William and Peleg Kittelle, and a dau. Almira, who m. Philip Davis.

James Kitteile(6). Married his cousin, Elizabeth King. See Kittelle Chapter. Abel Greene(5), b. Oct. 14, 1741 ; d. 1828 ; m. Ann (Nancy) King, 1764. Abel was a Revolutionary soldier. He and his sons had a grist-mill and a saw-miil. His wife was of the La Valley-King family. They had nine children, seven of them sons. Obediah, Abel Jr., and John Greene all moved to Susquehanna Co., Pa. Of Samuel, Mary, Elizabeth, Obediah, Paul and Jeremiah, there are only birth records.

The stream still runs by the old Tarbox Hall, six miles from Liverpool. Some of Lois Matteson's descendants have the coat-of-arms, an elaborate escutcheon with two full-length figures as supporters at the sides. The motto's meaning is"Destiny Separates, but Inclination Unites."

John Tarbox came to Lynn, Mass., by 1630. He was one of the first iron-workers, and turned out the

first kettles ever made in America. After John -1-, came John -2-, who came to East Greenwich about 1695. During the French and Indian War he was captured at Oswego. Again at the Crown Point expedition, he was made a prisoner, and remained so a year, dying on the coast of Africa in 1759. Samuel, his son, was then a grown young man, and married Lois three years after his patriotic father's death.

Of their large family of children, John Whipple, Benjamin, Margaret and Wealthian all married and moved to other parts, and their children are unknown. David's son Anthony left three daughters. Samuel had two children, John and Edith, but their children are unknown.

1. William Longmire was born in London England to George and Ann Longmire. He was baptized in 1704, and probably born that sameyear. To date, that's all we have on him until his arrest in October 1725.

Evidently, when William was about 21, he and a couple of his buddies were loitering on a street corner when a "Gentleman,deep in his cups" (a drunk property owner) staggered out into the street. They started teasing him a little bit, maybe pokingat him, and the drunk "gentleman" lost his hat. William, who was destined for a life in America, picked up the hat. The problemis, he didn't give it back. He ran down the street with it taunting him further. And that's how William got arrested.

The resulting charge: "Wm Longmire accused of accosting agentleman on the Kings Hwy and stealing his hat worth 5shillings." There is no record of an adequate defense and William was sentenced to hang.

Captain Charles Whales of the Rappahannock Merchant ship"purchased" William from the New Gate prison and brought him toAmerica to labor in the colonies for 14 years. William departed England in November 1725, and arrived in Virginia in April 1726. His death is a matter of Virginia record 1748-49.

William had three known sons: 1.1 George (the oldest), 1.2Charles (my line), and 1.3 William (the youngest).

William Longmire was our immigrant ancestor. He was christened on February 4, 1704 at St. Andrew Parish, Holborn, London Co., London, England, as was his sister, Anne, on February 14, 1706. According to Peter Wilson Coldham's "The Complete Book of Emigrants in Bondage, 1614-1775", William Longmire was tried in the London court in October 1725 and sentenced to"transportation" for 14 years. I have not been to London toresearch the court records, but Lianne Clause Longmire has.According to what she told me, William and some friends werestanding on a street corner in London. A man "deep in his cups" staggered by and the boys jostled and teased him, and his hatfell off. William grabbed it and ran up the street with the hat. The resulting charge was "William Longmire was accused of accosting a gentleman on the Kings Highway and stealing a hatworth 5 schillings." He was found guilty and sentenced to hang. There was no record of adequate defense. He was incarcerated inNewgate prison and was later sold to Capt. Charles Whale, ownerof the merchant ship "Rappahannock", for transportation to the colonies of America. He left London in November 1725 and arrivedin Virginia in April 1726. He was issued a Landing Certificateon his arrival. He probably served time as an indentured servantto some plantation owner since I find him in no Virginia recordsuntil 1738. According to the time frame, he would have been 35if he served his full term. Many entries in "Deed Abstracts of King George Co., VA, 1735-1752", show William Longmirewitnessing various documents, such as deeds, estate inventories, apprentice bonds, etc. The first entry found was dated March1738 and the last was dated June 3, 1748.

The King George Co., VA Order Book #2, p. 619, dated March 3,1749, states: "The nuncupative will of William Longmire, Dec'dwas presented into Court by Susanna Longmire." (a nuncupative will is an oral will that must later be reduced to writing). Anotation on the book entry stated that no will was found in therecords. An inventory of his estate was recorded in InventoryBook #2, p.47, dated June 2, 1749.

William Longmire, was indicted for Assaulting Thomas Warren on the Highway, putting him in fear, and taking from him a Hat val. 5 s. Sept. 1.

Thomas Warren thus deposed: Crossing Lincoln's-Inn-Fields, between Nine and Ten at Night, the Prisoner came by me, turn'd about, and look'd me full in the Face. I pass'd him, and he follow'd me. I went into the White Dragon Alehouse in Holborn, and he soon came in after me. I did not tarry long before I came out again. I saw no more of the Prisoner till I came to the Corner of Leather-Lane, and there he suddenly stept to me, knock'd me down, snatch'd off my Hat, and ran down the Lane. He endeavour'd to take my Wig too, but I made shift to hold it fast; and crying out, stop Thief, he was quickly taken and brought to me again.

Benjamin Mills thus deposed: I heard somebody cry, stop Thief, whereupon I and another pursued the Prisoner, who fell down; and so we took him and brought him back to Mr. Warren, who was coming to meet us as well as he could, for he was a little disguis'd in Drink; and by the way we found Mr. Warren's Hat.

James Noblet swore to the same Effect, and the Jury found the Prisoner Guilty . Death .

Upon Thursday, the 28th of October, the Report of the above-mentioned seven Malefactors under Sentence of Death was made to their Excellencies the Lords Justices in Council, and two of them, viz. William Longmire for a Street Robbery, and John Steele for returning from Transportation, receiv'd his Majesty's gracious Reprieve. If any of the Magistrates on the Bench, any of the Jury, or of Witnesses, who appear'd as Evidences against the said Malefactors, be desirous to know any thing more particularly, concerning their Behaviour, or Confessions before Death, or at the time of it, What for your information, we can farther add, is as fallows.

Foster Snow, of the Parish of St. Giles's in the Fields, was condemn'd for the Murder of Thomas Rawlins, by giving him, with a Knife, one mortal Wound, of the length of tine Inch, and depth of seven Inches, of which he instantly died. He was a second time indicted on the Stature of Stabbing. And a third time on the Coroners Inquest, for the said Murder. The Jury found him guilty of each Indictment; the Murder being evidently prov'd against him upon the Depositions of several Witnesses; neither did

he adduce any thing in his own Vindication, but only some who knew him depos'd that he was an honest, peaceable Neighbour.

======William Longmire was sentenced to death yet somehow managed a reprieve and was given a 14 year indenture to be served in the American colonies. He was transported by Captain Charles Whale on the Rappahannock Merchant and arrived at Port Royal 6 months later, right in the heart of the Northern Neck area of Virginia. To which plantation owner he went we don't know. However, it's apparent that he was released from his indenture approximately 3 years early. Shortly thereafter William was called as a witness in a 1737 court case, then later is found to be witnessing many deeds and several wills, also appraising estates in King George Co, Va into the early 1740's. How this change in fortune came about is still unknown, however it's quite apparent that William was trusted by respected members of his community. Later still he is found to be working for Captain Edward Dixon, a merchant who had ties to London, Bristol, and Glasgow. William is also found to have served on several juries at the K.G. Co Courthouse. Of interest is the fact that Edward Dixon's father-in-law was Col Thomas Turner II, a very large landowner and Clerk of the Court for K.G. Co - a very prestigious position in those days. William's entries for credit, money exchanges, and merchandise are well documented and are held in Washington, D.C. at the Library of Congress as part of the Edward Dixon Papers. Many examples of is fine penmanship, as well as that of his signature where her actually receives items for Col Turner can be found there.

Not only did William end up working for some interesting fellows in King George Co, Va as a trusted employee in a merchant/store capacity, but the legacy of his descendants is quite impressive. Those Longmires who are notable direct descendants include: several generations of doctors, including a world-renowned surgeon who helped found the UCLA School of Medicine, a gentleman who led the first wagon trains over the Cascade Mountains AND mapped out and led the first expeditions to the summit of Mt Ranier, two State Senators, several inventors, a slew of professors and physicists, including one who worked with Teller and Oppenhiemer, and of course William's 3 Colonial pioneer sons and their families who helped make it all happen.

Also, it has been speculated, but not proven, that William Longmire m. Susannah Marshall. William's marriage to his wife, Susannah, undoubtedly took place in the 1730's but no record of the date has been found. It also appears that William was released from his indenture early as shown by his presence in court as early as 1737 where he was paid for 5 days service. If he was still under the auspices of a master at that time I believe the record would have stipulated payment to go to said master.

The church records for Neckarau, home of Christoffel Meckendorfer only begin with 1650. In fact very few church record in Germany exist for the period before 1648-50. The Thirty Years War devastated most of Germany and left towns, villages and churches in ruins and one third of the population dead. So in the years after the War, which ended in 1648 there was a vast reshuffling of people, moving about looking for new homes and rebuilding old ones. I recently checked the Neckarau records to see if earlier researchers missed anything and did find this very significant piece of information: Inserted in the early baptisms-

Anno 1653- hatt sich Jacob Christoffel Meckendorffer am 27th May angegeben vom Papistishen glauben zum Reformierten sich zu bekehren...etc.

Translated this says- On 27 May Jacob Christoffel Meckendorffer announce that he had converted from Papist [ie. Catholic] belief to the Reformed faith. It goes on to say that as a result of his confession of faith he was admitted into membership in the Reformed Church. There are no Catholic records for Neckarau for those years.
